Memorial Society of Northern Ontario (MSNO) is a volunteer-run, non-profit organization, incorporated in the Province of Ontario. MSNO is independent of government and religious institutions and does not own or operate any funeral-related or other business. MSNO derives all income from its membership through fees and donations, and uses all money received for public awareness and operating purposes.

Your Choices

Memorial Societies provide information about two types of low-cost, dignified funerals, Type 'A' and Type 'B', each with the choice of cremation or burial. The funeral provider (funeral home or transfer service) will contact the cemetery or crematorium on your behalf and, if requested, will arrange for return of the ashes.

TYPE 'A'

Type 'A' is usually chosen by members who wish no service or a memorial service at a later date. The funeral provider transfers the deceased, obtains the legal documents, provides a plain casket and transports the deceased to the cemetery or crematorium. Family members may arrange a private viewing.

TYPE 'B'

Type 'B' includes the basic services described in Type 'A' above with a cloth-covered casket. Type 'B' also includes visitation, use of funeral chapel and car to transport family.

Note: MSNO surveys our participating funeral homes every two years to determine their current prices for the two types of funerals. This information is available on request, but we encourage you to consult the funeral home of your choice to find out their current rates and any additional fees.
